1. Camera knowledge:

You only have a 400 ISO film in your camera and want to shoot some picture of speedskaters.

Your lightmeter tells you to use F 22 and 1/8 sec. To what aperture/shutterspeed combination will you adjust your settings when you can't change the ISO setting? Explain your choice? Recalculate.

To what filmspeed would you have to adjust your camera, so that you will be able to shoot with the combination aperture/shutterspeed 1/500 sec and F 8? Based on 400 ISO - F22 en 1/8. Explain.

How many stops can you vary your Aperture of your lens? Write down the stops.

How fast are your lenses? What are the consequences for your D.O.F? (fast=smallest Aperture nr.)

2. Analogue knowledge: (only for Darkroom Course)

You have printed a picture on filter/gradation 2 (normal) for 10 sec. exposure time. The black parts in your print are already black but the white parts in your print are still to light. What do you have to adjust to get a technically good print which reproduces all the tones in the original scènes?

How do you change the contrast of the paper? How does it work? Why would you use it?

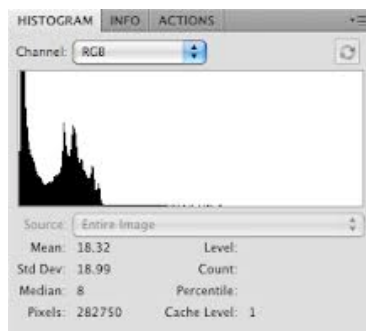
3. Digital knowledge:

You want to create a high quality print from a digital file. What is the minimal resolution you want to use? Why?

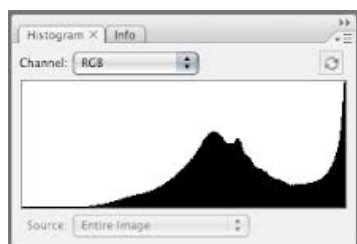
The digital print shows too much contrast. How do you correct this in Photoshop or Lightroom?
